

Supporting mental health & wellness

JFCS' Annual Benefit Fund-a-Need this year will raise money for mental health and wellness.

Mental health and wellness are at the core of JFCS' mission to sustain healthy relationships and ease suffering. They are interwoven into all areas of service and support that JFCS provides, including eliminating barriers to successful careers; engaging and connecting with community; finding stability in our lives; and caring for our families.

- Mental Health Education Conference participant Numerous JFCS program areas have a focus on promoting positive mental health and wellness – Counseling, the Mental Health Education Conference, Jewish Youth Mentoring Program, Intake and Resource Connection, Family Life Education, and Addiction and Recovery Services. These programs are just some of the ways we help and support mental health and wellness for all who turn to us.

Counseling

The Counseling team recognizes the courage it takes to reach

out for services. We all experience challenges and low periods in life, and while there are known benefits of therapy, the actual act of opening up to someone you don't know can be scary. It can make you feel vulnerable and uncomfortable. Our team of skilled clinicians provides a compassionate, warm, and judgment free environment for folks to explore the challenges they are facing. Children, adolescents, and adults who work with our clinicians can expect to feel heard, to find support through their challenges, and to know they are not alone.

Mental Health Education Conference

The Annual Mental Health Education Conference has been an important resource for the community for more than 20 years. The event, which started as a community response to the death of an individual having a mental health crisis, has grown into an annual event focused on reducing stigma, and providing education and support for individuals living with a mental health issue, their family, friends, and healthcare providers. The conference, especially now that we are back in person, has created an important touchstone for people who are marking their own mental health journey and an entry point for individuals and families facing new mental health challenges.



is core to JFCS' mission

The Jewish Youth Mentoring

Program proves that anyone can benefit from a personal, one-on-on connection. Whether mentor or mentee, personal connection provides enhanced self-esteem and self-confidence; stronger relationships with parents, teachers, and peers, and a stronger Jewish identity. Children spend time with someone who is giving their undivided attention; sharing activities like visiting libraries, sporting events, museums, arts and crafts, biking, visiting parks, playing games, and more. Children and their mentors create meaningful connections to each other and the community with the guidance and support of JFCS staff. Free to both mentor and mentee, this program has a long history of making powerful matches, meaningful relationships and lifelong friendships.

Intake and Resource Connection

Intake and Resource Connection (IRC) is often the first point of contact with individuals seeking support through JFCS. Knowing the courage and vulnerability it takes to ask for help, our team of intake counselors create a welcoming and confidential space for callers to discuss their complex situations and needs. By conducting a holistic assessment with each individual, IRC assists with problem-solving and helps to identify needs and supports available. IRC intake counselors are the "connectors" of the agency, completing intake and enrollment for various JFCS programs and services, as well as referrals to additional resources within our community.

Family Life Education

Family Life Education (FLE) takes JFCS out into the community and brings the community into JFCS through presentations, trainings, workshops,

classes, support groups, individual meetings and consultations. The foundations of FLE are collaboration, prevention, and education with the goal of promoting individual, family and community well-being and empowerment throughout the lifespan. Customized programming includes topics such as parenting workshops, parent coaching, teacher trainings, addressing interfaith challenges, bullying, grief and loss, supporting caregivers, addressing challenging current events in meaningful ways, and building healthy relationships.

Addiction and Recovery Services

Addiction and Recovery Services support families and individuals who are impacted by Substance Use Disorder and other addictions. Addiction is a family disease and our programs support the family as a whole. Programming includes education about addiction for diverse audiences: confidential consultations with family members; and referrals to a variety of resources in the Twin Cities and beyond. We work closely with the Family Life Education department at JFCS and focus on education, prevention and collaboration to support families and reduce stigma around addiction in all forms. Our work is informed by the principles of harm reduction.

Mental health and wellness challenges can impact anyone, regardless of age, race, or socio-economic background. By supporting the JFCS programs that address these issues, you can make a positive impact for both individuals and the community at large. Hamas-Israel war: How to begin conversations with your children

In the weeks since the attack on Israel, many have asked how do we talk to our children about it? Our children deserve to know what is happening in an age-appropriate way and as parents and caregivers, it is our instinct to keep our children safe; but we also know that danger exists in the world. Parents have an especially challenging job in talking about recent events that impact Jewish families so very personally. Many families have lost loved ones, their sense of security, and hope for the future.

Everyday decisions for many have become harder to make in the face of this unfolding tragedy. Decisions about going to Jewish spaces, safety, and going about our daily tasks have become harder. Many adults and children may be feeling uncertain now and everyday life is taking a back seat to the news and managing the big emotions. Decision and media fatigue are real.

Know that you are not alone in the challenging tasks at hand. Approaching challenging conversations with our children requires parents to be their most human, vulnerable, and open selves.

You are not alone if you are feeling a sense of anxiety around it or avoiding it. Beginning the conversation about the war in Israel with your children in a loving and age-appropriate way is crucial. Doing so will allow them to ask you questions and they can hear the news from you, rather than other unvetted or uncontrolled sources (other kids or untrusted "news" sites online).

A few quick tips include: Start the conversation by asking your child what they know already and go from there; avoid any graphic images or videos; keep conversations short; avoid many details with younger children; discuss where you get your news and why with your older children; and keep an open door policy to continue these conversations.

Also be sure to watch your own media diet. Notice how much news you are consuming, how you feel afterwards, and how much time you are spending. There is usually a threshold of information we reach and continuing to consume news after that point is not often helpful to our wellbeing.

While these conversations can feel overwhelming to begin, realize that you don't need to be the expert. What is most important is that you bring up the topic so your child knows you are there for them and they can talk to you. Simply being present will reduce anxiety they may be feeling. Bringing up the topic when your family is feeling calm will increase feelings of safety and build trust between you and your children, regardless of their age.

NextGen program continues to introduce young adults to JFCS and its mission

JFCS NextGen Coordinator Molly Knopf highlights the group's recent activities and looks forward to what it has in store for 2024

Molly Knopf, who started as the JFCS NextGen Coordinator earlier this year, recently spoke about how the group serves as a resource for young adults who want to represent JFCS and its mission in the community.

Why did the NextGen Coordinator position appeal to you? What makes the program unique?

I got my start in the volunteer department at the Jewish Family Service (JFS) of Los Angeles before coming here and knew that I wanted to stay in the Jewish social services world. What initially drew me to NextGen was the opportunity to work with young adults to engage in tikkun olam in creative ways, which is a principle that is very important to me.

The JFS of L.A. had no young adult programs, as it had a larger focus on senior services. That was a really rewarding experience, but I was excited by the possibility of working with a completely different age group. NextGen was the kind of program I would join anyway as a transplant to the area interested in meeting other Jewish young adults, so I love that this is my job now.

What activities has NextGen been up to lately?

I kicked off my start as coordinator with a barbecue at the outgoing coordinator's place in June, and since then, our Board has been meeting once a month to plan out the rest of the year. In September, we had a volunteering event with Open Arms of Minnesota in partnership with Volunteers in Action! We held our Fall Party in October, which was a great event, and we have our usual Hag Sameach volunteering events in November. In December, we're excited for the NextGen After-Party at JFCS' Annual Benefit, as well as a joint Chanukah Party with JFCS' Caring Connections program. It's been a busy start to this term!

The number of people from the NextGen demographic attending JFCS' Annual Benefit seems to be growing and this year there will be a NextGen After-Party at the event – what do you think is driving this interest?

I'd like to say that it is that our program is achieving one of its goals - to introduce young adults to JFCS and all that it offers so that they can find ways to stay involved with the agency for a lifetime. We've been around long enough that many of our members have started families and joined PJ Library, and several of them have even graduated from the NextGen Board to what we call the "big board," or the main JFCS Board. It seems like a natural progression that a growing number of NextGen members would be interested in our Benefit, and we really want to offer opportunities for continued engagement in ways like hosting the Benefit After-Party.

What's on the horizon for NextGen in 2024?

Plenty! We have some repeats of annual events, like our Spring Party or our Passover volunteering with Hag Sameach, so we're excited to continue those traditions. We're also looking at new avenues of collaboration, both with programs in JFCS and outside of it. For example, I was recently connected to a non-profit focused on getting kids school supplies, so I'm working with them to see if we can organize a service project or donation drive. The Board is focused on providing a wide range of volunteer opportunities alongside our usual social events, so expect a lot of those coming up!

Anything else you would like to add?

If anyone reading is a young Jewish adult in the Twin Cities looking to be more involved in the community, or knows someone who fits that profile, please reach out to me! We are always looking to connect with people. It doesn't matter if you're new here or have lived in the Twin Cities your whole life, we want to provide a space for you.

As demand for therapy remains high, JFCS Counseling program expands number of therapeutic approaches

From Walk+Talk therapy to programs for children with anxiety, Counseling Manager **Angela Cowan** speaks about what makes JFCS' Counseling program unique

t JFCS, Counseling is a collaborative effort between the counselor and client. Our licensed therapists help clients identify goals and potential solutions to problems that cause emotional turmoil, improve communication, coping skills and symptom management, strengthen self-esteem, promote behavior change, feel better and function at their best.

JFCS Counseling Manager Angela Cowan, who started in her position in March, recently spoke about how the demand for therapy services remains high, the different types of therapies that JFCS Counseling program offers, and what someone who has never received counseling services can expect when they come to the agency.

Why did the Counseling Manager position appeal to you? What are the strengths of JFCS' Counseling program?

After several years working in the mental health field, I was interested in a position that would allow me to continue to work in direct client services while also building skills in program management and supervision. My excitement grew as I learned more about the programming, mission, and values of JFCS. I continue to be amazed by the programs and services the agency offers to the community.

I am grateful for the opportunity to work not only at JFCS, but alongside the talented therapists on our Counseling team. There are five full-time therapists on our team with a wide range of clinical specialties. The JFCS Counseling team provides therapy for trauma, grief/loss, depression, anxiety, severe and persistent mental illness, and relationships, among other concerns. Our experienced and skilled team serves clients throughout the lifespan, including individuals and couples, and is continually working to build and hone our clinical skills.

A few years removed from the worst of the pandemic, has the demand for counseling services remained high?

Yes - the demand has remained high. In the larger metro area, many therapists have waitlists or are not accepting new clients. On our Counseling team, we consistently have several new clients starting each month, and this fall we

have seen an increase in weekly counseling referrals. From the beginning of 2022 to today, we have seen a steady increase in clients seeking counseling services in JFCS. The number of clients our team works with has increased nearly 40% since the beginning of 2022.

What types of therapies does JFCS' program offer?

JFCS offers several types of therapeutic approaches. Our therapists offer play therapy for children and SPACE (Supportive Parenting for Anxious Childhood Emotions) to work with parents of children with anxious emotions. For adults, our therapists can offer Walk+Talk therapy, Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), Acceptance and Commitment Therapy, Accelerated Resolution Therapy (ART), Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), among other modalities. Our services for couples include Emotion-Focused Therapy (EFT), PREPARE and Discernment Counseling. We work with children, adolescents, adults, and partners. Some of our therapies can be specifically designed for clients healing from trauma. We can offer both in-person appointments and telehealth appointments.

For someone who has never received counseling services, what can they expect if they come to JFCS?

When you reach out to JFCS for counseling services, you will first complete an intake with our Intake & Resource Connection (IRC) team. After completing that intake, you will be connected to a therapist. At your first appointment, you can expect to meet with a compassionate, caring and experienced therapist, who is there to learn more about your concerns - and ultimately what you are hoping therapy can help with. Our therapists will not and cannot tell you what to do, but they can listen to your concerns; walk with you on your journey; work with you to challenge behaviors and thoughts you want to change; and help you identify ways to regulate emotions that feel unmanageable.

A real-life update 15 years later:

Caleb's story shows first-hand how ParentChild+ program leads to success

Caleb, who participated in ParentChild+ before kindergarten, graduated from high school this spring

FCS is always so proud of the hundreds of families that graduate every year from our ParentChild+ program because we know they • are taking the steps to set their children up for success. Decades of research shows children who participate in the pre-K home visiting program are 50% less likely to need special education services by third grade and 30% more likely to graduate from high school.

Nevertheless, we rarely get to hear firsthand accounts of high school success from former participants simply because it is so many years later. But that's exactly what happened this spring when Ruth Ann contacted us to proudly announce that her son, Caleb, a former ParentChild+ participant, was graduating from high school in June.

"We have always wanted to know more about the families we have served in Minnesota since we brought the program here in 2006," said Kristi Murray, JFCS Director of Education and Learning. "Ruth Ann and Caleb reaching out after all these years to share with us how much this program supported Caleb's learning, his school success, and how Ruth Ann was empowered in her parenting was such a wonderful gift to us."

Providing assistance at a critical time

Caleb started what was then called the Parent-Child Home Program in 2007, just one year after JFCS established it in Minnesota. Caleb is actually the grandson of Ruth Ann - her son's son. Due to unforeseen circumstances, Ruth Ann officially adopted him as her son.

Ruth Ann was referred to the program by the food shelf at STEP in St. Louis Park. It came into their lives at a critical time. Ruth Ann suddenly became a mother of a toddler at an older age while she was needing to work full time – she felt like she had no idea how to help him learn at the time.

Caleb had a lot of big feelings surrounding all that happened to him during the earliest years of his life. ParentChild+ staff encouraged Ruth Ann to let Caleb know she hears him and to allow him to process his feelings with her. We also provided referrals to supportive services.

"The way you did things was wonderful for us," Ruth Ann said about ParentChild+. "You brought such nice things to teach him. It was a godsend. I was very interested in doing it because it was a way to bond with my child and it was a way to learn how he learns. At that time, I needed those tools."

Caleb is on the Autism spectrum and traditional teaching methods were not working at the time, so ParentChild+ helped Ruth Ann think of creative ways to help him learn. For instance, when staff learned Caleb loved brownies, they encouraged her to cut brownies into different shapes. When he identified the correct brownie shape, he got to eat it. The process was very effective.

"The program taught me about bonding and teaching," Ruth Ann said. "Caleb has always been a kinesthetic learner - touching, feeling. I would have never known about these things. Everything was a learning experience."

In fact, when Caleb was in junior high and the shapes and math problems were much more difficult, Ruth Ann advocated with his teachers to teach him in similar kinesthetic methods, knowing it would help. She said ParentChild+ helped her learn how to become an advocate for Caleb throughout his school career.

Caleb's story inspires others

Caleb is interested in computers and coding – he even built a computer at home all by himself. He hopes to go to the Dunwoody College of Technology to study radiologic technology.

He wasn't the only one to benefit from ParentChild+. Ruth Ann said the program reminded her about the importance of education and inspired her to get two IT tech degrees while she was raising Caleb. She encourages him to keep focusing on his education, no matter how long it takes. "You can do anything you want to do, even if it takes you longer," she said. "That's what I tell him."

Hearing about Caleb's graduation and how far he has come is inspiring to ParentChild+ staff, Kristi said. "Hearing their success story motivates our team to continue the work of ParentChild+ to support even more families in Minnesota create their own success stories," she said.

Looking back on how far Caleb has come, Ruth Ann has nothing but immense pride in him and is excited to see what he will accomplish in the future.

"I feel something different for Caleb – he has had such adversity in his life," she said. "He is destined for something great. He is going to influence something that is going to change the world."



ParentChild+

ParentChild+ is a free home visiting program that promotes creative ways to learn through play, increases parenting skills and helps children prepare for school. Participants can select either in-person home visits following safety protocols or virtual visits. Participants will receive deliveries including free books, toys, and guide sheets.

Year-end giving: Let's make it year-round giving

y best friend from college - and to this day - has had a varied and wonderful career in the informal Jewish education space, most currently as an independent consultant for Jewish educational experiences and curriculum. Throughout her career, the organizations she worked with have been the recipients of philanthropic dollars from grants, family foundations, and individuals.

In many of these cases, Robyn has been the grant writer and grant manager for awarded funds. In addition, she has helped develop curriculum, facilitate, and train staff for teen philanthropy programs, and has participated in national conversations around the curriculum and growth of the field of Jewish-teen philanthropy.

Robyn has always identified herself as a Jewish education professional, a grantee, a trainer, a mentor, and an occasional sporadic charitable giver, but not until recently did Robyn see herself as an intentional donor and philanthropist.

I can tell you that Robyn's journey – which took her from Jewish educator and grantee to serious donor and philanthropist – is actually one many of us should see a reflection of in ourselves. While most of us are not Jewish professionals, we are working in some capacity as a professional. We could all consider ourselves to be educators, whether it is formally or informally, and all of us have been on the receiving end of the generosity of others.

What I think most people don't recognize in themselves is the ability to be a deliberate committed donor and philanthropist. Our pre-conceived notion is that you must be wealthy; that there is a minimum gift to be in this category or a status of some sort. But I am here to challenge that idea. Fidelity Charitable defines a philanthropist as a person who donates time, money, experience, skills or talent to help create a better world. Anyone can be a philanthropist, regardless of status or net worth. The Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines a philanthropist as one who makes an active effort to promote human welfare. What Robyn didn't see in herself was the ability, even at a minimum financial commitment, to be a purposeful, focused and steadfast donor (aka a philanthropist).

Jewish Family and Children's Service of Minneapolis serves nearly 13,000 people each year of all ages and backgrounds. We live our values every day based on Jewish concepts and teachings such as Tikkun Olam (repairing the world) or Tzedakah (the Hebrew word for charity rooted in a pursuit of justice). Giving is viewed as more than a financial transaction, it is a way for donors to have a soulful benefit, as much or more so than the recipients.

As we end the year and start 2024 (or 5784), I urge you to consider yourself with the identity of philanthropist (a purposeful faithful donor guided by core values). What are those values that have been passed down to you from previous generations? What are the values by which you live your life? Remember, a value is how you conduct yourself, make day-to-day ethical decisions, and how you treat others.

While you may give to the same places or causes that your parents or grandparents did, or that your friends are involved with, you may take this opportunity to explore your own passions. Give to the places, programs and services that you care about, engage with, and provide meaning to you, your family and/or friends. The size of your gift does not matter – it is the meaningful action of giving, the feeling you get from it and the impact you have on others that makes you a philanthropist.
