HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR SUPPORT

JFCS Senior Services professional staff works closely with Holocaust survivors to ensure safe, supported and dignified living, and connects them to resources and compensation payment programs.

Support is tailored to the individual's needs and may include the following:

- > Case management to assess and identify needs and develop a comprehensive care plan
- > Connection to JFCS services, including meals on wheels, transportation, counseling, holiday gifts, shopping and community volunteer support
- > Information and referrals to other community resources, and publicly funded support programs
- > Eligible Holocaust survivors may qualify for homecare services, including housekeeping and personal care, compensation payment programs, grocery gifts cards and medical and dental expense reimbursement. The Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany (Claims Conference) determines eligibility criteria.
